
AAT-R RESULTS: Low



ASSESSMENT SCORE: LOW

For Phonological Awareness, your child scored low compared to their peers indicating a higher likelihood of dyslexia.

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN?

The AAT-R assessment is for phonological awareness, an individual's ability to hear the sound structure of words.

When a child is unable to hear the sounds words make, they have a much harder time with reading and spelling.

When this score is low, it typically also corroborates with a low score in reading or spelling.

It is expected that these skills measured in the AAT-R are mastered by the end of second grade.

As most curriculum moves to "reading to learn" in 3rd grade, deficits in this area now require remedial instruction or support groups.
